3.	<b>Training unit/locations</b>	This post is based within both Greater Glasgow & Clyde and NHS Lanarkshire. Six months will be at Glasgow Dental Hospital (GDH) then six months at NHS Lanarkshire PDS.
4.	<b>Rotational Post information and Duration</b>	Rotational  September 2024 – March 2025: Departments of Orthodontics and Paediatric Dentistry both within Glasgow Dental Hospital & School with sessions at the Royal Hospital for Children, Glasgow (RHCG)  March 2025 – August 2025 - NHS Lanarkshire: Public Dental Service (PDS, also referred to as the Community Dental Service).

9.	<b>Description of training post</b>	The GDH part of the post will commence in September 2024 through to March 2025. This placement is ideally suited to anyone interested in Orthodontics or Paediatric Dentistry.  The Orthodontic department offers a wide range of Orthodontic experience including consultant supervised treatment/review sessions, new patient clinics and Emergency clinics. Opportunities are available to attend a variety of joint clinics

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		<p>such as orthognathic surgery, cleft care and restorative dentistry to give as wide an exposure as possible to the range of Orthodontic treatment carried out within the hospital service.</p> <p>The Paediatric Department in GDH may offer clinical experience in the following: new patient assessment; treatment sessions, including inhalation sedation; dental accident and emergency; dental trauma management; and multidisciplinary clinics. Clinical time will also be spent within RHC where DCTs may gain experience in new patient assessment and treatment of medically complex children and the in-/out-patient care of children requiring priority dental care, including those with oncology, haematology and cardiac diagnoses.</p> <p>The DCT1 will undertake a range of PDS duties from March 2025 to August 2025. This part of the post may include, but is not restricted to, dental inspection of schools, domiciliary care in a variety of settings including care homes, private residences and hospital sites, care of patients who have additional needs or require special care, and paediatric dentistry as well as delivery of emergency dental care to both PDS and unregistered patient groups. There will also be opportunities receive training in inhalation sedation and there may be opportunities to participate in GA lists as well as shadow IV sedation clinics</p>

13.	<b>Educational programme summary</b>	<p>There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement &amp; Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual DCT conference.</p> <p>All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This is predominantly to fund attendance of DCTs at the compulsory NES Educational events, however funding may be available to contribute to the cost of other courses linked to an agreed PDP.</p>

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		DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.
