6.	Travelling commitment	There will be a requirement to travel within the Health Board area in order to obtain a range of experience.

8.	Description of the training post	This post is based at Ninewells Hospital. The post DCT Fellow will work in a rotational system, usually of three months duration, being assigned to a named Consultant who is their Clinical Trainer. The post DCT fellow will attend Out-Patient Clinics, theatre sessions and pre-assessment Clinics and will be responsible for admission and care of all OMFS inpatients in Ninewells, and the Day Case Units in PRI and Ninewells. Trainees will receive training in a number of surgical procedures. The incorporation of Foundation Doctors on the ward has assisted in the safe delivery of all acute medical care. The post DCT fellow will have the opportunity to participate in the informal teaching of Medical and Dental Students. Opportunities also exist to attend other clinical presentations and meetings occurring elsewhere in Ninewells Hospital and a postgraduate teaching calendar is available. The post DCT Fellow will be encouraged to undertake research/quality improvement projects, usually in conjunction with senior or academic colleagues. This department has a strong record in achieving publications for motivated trainees.

10.	Pattern of working, including any on-call commitment	The current working pattern is a shift system of 48 hours per week. The contracted hours of duty are as follows: Standard Working Week - 40 hours + 8 hours on-call – this can normally be delivered from out with the hospital as long as residence is nearby.
11.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	<p>There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Post DCT Fellows which incorporates components of the DCT curriculum. These events will involve all the Post DCT Fellows in Scotland and will be held virtually during 2021. The annual trainee conference will give an opportunity for all Dental Core Trainees to submit work to be presented.</p> <p>These Post DCT Fellowship posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality</p>

		<p>improvement projects or research. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP.</p> <p>All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course: Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will be made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course.</p>
