4.	Training unit/location/s	This post is based within NHS Ayrshire and Arran Health Board. Six months will be at North West Kilmarnock Area Centre (NWAC) PDS then six months at Crosshouse Hospital, Kilmarnock.
5.	Full address of training units where training will take place	North West Kilmarnock Teach and Treat Clinic North West Area Centre, Western Road, Kilmarnock, KA3 1NQ. Crosshouse Hospital, Kilmarnock Road, Crosshouse KA2 0BE.
6.	Travelling commitment	There will be a requirement to travel within the NHS Ayrshire and Arran Board area in order to obtain a range of experience.
7.	Educational Supervisor	Will be confirmed with post-holder
8.	Description of the training post	The DCT1 will undertake a range of duties from September 2022 – March 2023. These duties may include dental inspection of schools, domiciliary care, care of patients who have additional needs or require special care, paediatrics and treatment of patients within GDS terms and conditions. There will also be opportunities to participate in GA lists and receive training in inhalation sedation. The following six months from March 2023 to August 2023 the DCT1 will be based in Crosshouse Hospital. Dentoalveolar surgery still constitutes the majority of the work carried out by the OMFS unit, which is mainly dealt with by Specialty Doctor(s) and DCTs under supervision. The consultants also undertake dentoalveolar surgery in the day surgery unit. Orthognathic surgery, facial trauma, facial cancer, oral medicine, TMJ disease and facial pain and implantology services are also provided.
9.	Primary Care training element	In this post the DCT1 will work for six months in the Public Dental Service. You therefore need to be eligible for an NHS list number.
10.	Pattern of working, including any on-call commitment	PDS: 37 hours per week between 8.30am - 4:30pm on weekdays, excluding lunchbreaks. OMFS: 40 hours per week. 8:30am - 5:00pm weekdays with one on-call night per week, 5:00pm - 8:30am. Weekend on-call is 1:6 and is Saturday 8:30 am to Monday 8:30 am Note:(On-call is under review and conditions may alter by September 2020).
11.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for DCT1s which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme will include an induction followed by a number of study events throughout the year, supported by Turas

Learn. These events will be delivered with a mix of face to face and online sessions, which will include all DCT1s training in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference which includes the DCT2s and DCT3s. In addition, there will be an education programme for DCT1s during their time in the Public Dental Service which has been designed to support this role.

All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT1 posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.

All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course:

Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course.
