8.	Description of the training post	There are three posts at Ninewells Hospital. The DCT2/3's work in a rotational system. The DCT's attend Out-Patient Clinics, theatre sessions and pre-assessment Clinics and are responsible for admission and care of all OMFS inpatients in Ninewells, and the Day Case Units in PRI and Ninewells. Trainees will receive training in a number of surgical procedures. The incorporation of Foundation Doctors on the ward has assisted in the safe delivery of all acute medical care. The DCT's have the opportunity to participate in the informal teaching of Medical and Dental Students. Opportunities also exist to attend other clinical presentations and meetings occurring elsewhere in Ninewells Hospital and a postgraduate teaching calendar is available. The DCT's are encouraged to undertake research/quality improvement projects, usually in conjunction with senior or academic colleagues. This department has a strong record in achieving publications for motivated trainees.
9.	Primary Care training element	N/A
10.	On-call commitment	Monday – Friday. It is not expected that the DCT's will undertake on call commitment after 18:00 hrs or on weekends. On call commitments during the working weekdays is expected 08:00 – 18:00 hrs.  This post does not carry additional banding supplement. The on call commitment for the night and weekends is to be delivered by 5 Clinical Fellows appointed by NHST and out with NES.

		Where a gap exists in the on call structure DCT's maybe offered additional hours of work paid by NHST at the structured Bank Rates as approved by BMA. DCT's are encouraged to enrol on the Bank Staff.
11.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement & Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by a number of face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.  All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course: Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course.
