9.	Description of training post	 In the Public Dental Services (PDS) rotation from September 2025 – March 2026 you will have the opportunity to work in a variety of locations across PDS with a range of clinical









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supervisors. You will be involved in/have experience of the delivery of high-quality dental care for vulnerable PDS patient groups, including children and adults with special care requirements and those attending for unscheduled care. This will include those more medically complex patients, those requiring additional equipment to facilitate care, and those adults and children who have additional support needs. You will receive supported training with experienced PDS practitioners for the assessment, treatment planning and management of paediatric patients including under Inhalation Sedation and General anaesthetic. You will gain experience in a range of behaviour management techniques and alternative treatment modalities including Silver Diamine Fluoride. There may be opportunities for experience in National Primary Care Public Health programmes. To maximise clinical experience, we require you to travel within the NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde health board area to different PDS clinics.

- The GDH part of the post will commence in March 2026 through to August 2026. This placement is ideally suited to anyone interested in Orthodontics or Paediatric Dentistry. The Orthodontic department offers a wide range of orthodontic experience including consultant supervised treatment/review sessions, new patient clinics and Emergency clinics. Opportunities are available to attend a variety of joint clinics in orthognathic surgery, paediatrics, cleft care and restorative dentistry to give as wide an exposure as possible to the range of orthodontic treatment carried out within the hospital.
- The Paediatric Department in GDH may offer clinical experience in the following: new patient assessment; treatment sessions, including inhalation sedation; dental accident and emergency; dental trauma management; and multidisciplinary clinics. Clinical time will also be spent within RHCG where DCTs may gain experience in new patient assessment and treatment of medically complex children and the in-/ out-patient care of children requiring priority dental care, including those with oncology, haematology and cardiac diagnoses.
