8.	<b>Description of the training post</b>	There are three posts at Ninewells Hospital. The DCT3s work in a rotational system, usually of three weeks duration. The DCT3s attend Out-Patient Clinics, theatre sessions and pre-assessment Clinics and are responsible for admission and care of all OMFS inpatients in Ninewells, and the Day Case Units in PRI and Ninewells. Trainees will receive training in a number of surgical procedures. The incorporation of Foundation Doctors on the ward has assisted in the safe delivery of all acute medical care. The DCT3s have the opportunity to participate in the informal teaching of Medical and Dental Students. Opportunities also exist to attend other clinical presentations and meetings occurring elsewhere in Ninewells Hospital and a postgraduate teaching calendar is available. The DCT3s are encouraged to undertake research/quality improvement projects, usually in conjunction with senior or academic colleagues. This department has a strong record in achieving publications for motivated trainees.

10.	<b>Educational programme summary and library facilities</b>	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for DCT3s which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme will include an induction followed by a number of study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events will be delivered with a mix of face to face and online sessions, which will include all DCT3s training in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference which includes the DCT1s and DCT2s. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT3 posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.  All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously,

		attend an additional two-day induction course: Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will be made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course.
