DGRI is a new hospital which opened in 2017. The following six months in PDS is based at Dumfries Dental Centre, which is a modern 18 surgery dental facility providing Special Care Dentistry and Dental Student Outreach and Dental Therapist training. It is the largest Outreach dental training facility in Scotland hosting 12 dental students per week.

9.	Description of training post	•	The DCT1 will undertake a range of PDS duties from September 2025 to March 2026. This will involve the provision of comprehensive dental care for registered paediatric and adult patients with additional needs and assessment and treatment of referred patients including management of dental anxiety. The DCT1 will also attend regular exodontia and comprehensive care theatre lists for patients with additional needs 2 weeks and will receive training and become an experienced operator-sedationist in inhalation sedation. Upon completion of the post, DCTs will have completed a logbook evidencing independent sedation provision for both children and adults. The post will also include regular domiciliary dental visits and opportunities to attend prison dental clinics, dental inspection of schoolchildren and both Outreach dental student and therapy student teaching clinics. There will also be a requirement to treat unregistered emergency patients from across the region with the option of participating in additional paid out of hours evening and weekend clinics. The second part of the post will be based in DGRI from March 2026 to August 2026. There is supervised training both in theatre and outpatients, the latter in both OMFS and oral surgery. General outpatients, the latter in both OMFS and oral surgery. General outpatient clinics see referrals from dental and medical practitioners, as well as the community and hospital services. The DCTs will have opportunity to perform biopsies on H&N clinics and participate in combined orthodontic/ Oral Surgery and Orthodontic/OMFS clinics. Involvement is encouraged in the management of these patients. There is excellent exposure to minor oral surgery, intravenous sedation and some orthodontics, with direct 1-to-1 mentoring and supervision . There is no out of hours on call for DCTs.
