4.	Training unit/location/s	This post is based within NHS Tayside. Six months will be based at King's Cross Outreach Centre, PDS and six months will be at Dundee Dental Hospital (DDH)
5.	Full address of training units where training will take place	<p>King's Cross Outreach Centre, Clepington Road, Dundee, DD3 8EA.</p> <p>Plus additional clinics within NHS Tayside Dundee Dental Hospital, Park Place, Dundee, DD3 8EA</p>
6.	Travelling commitment	There will be a requirement to travel within the NHS Tayside Board area in order to obtain a range of experience.
7.	Educational Supervisor	Will be confirmed with post-holder
8.	Description of the training post	<p>In this DCT1 post, you will undertake a range of PDS duties from September 2020 to March 2021: this may include dental inspection of schools, domiciliary care, care of patients who have additional needs or require special care; paediatric dentistry and treatment of patients within GDS terms and conditions. There may also be opportunities to participate in GA lists. You should have the opportunity to receive training in inhalation sedation.</p> <p>The post at DDH will run from March 2021 to August 2021. As a DCT1 you will have opportunities to gain experience in a mix including dental accident and emergency and restorative dentistry</p>
9.	Primary Care training element	In this post the DCT1 will work for six months in the PDS. You therefore need to be eligible for an NHS list number.
10.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	<p>There is a Scotland-wide education programme for DCT1s which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme will include an induction followed by a number of study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events will be delivered with a mix of face to face and online sessions, which will include all DCT1s training in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference which includes the DCT2s and DCT3s. In addition, there will be an education programme for DCT1s during their time in the Public Dental Service which has been designed to support this role.</p> <p>All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be</p>

		<p>used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses that are appropriate to the DCT's stage of training and on a relevant topic. DCT1 posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.</p> <p>All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course: Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will be made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course.</p>
