Description of the training post	<p>The first part of the post is based in the Restorative Dentistry Department at Glasgow Dental Hospital and School from September 2022 to March 2023 and will offer experience in the following aspects of dentistry; Periodontology, Fixed and Removable Prosthodontics and Endodontics. There are both core and specialty level training post holders working throughout the department. There is a close working relationship with the School for Dental Care Professionals and the University of Glasgow Dental School, both located within GDH. Clinical experiences may include new patient referral clinics, treatment sessions, including basic surgical training, supervision of BDS or BSc students, and an emergency patient session.</p> <p>The second placement in this post from March 2023 to August 2023 is ideally suited to anyone interested in Paediatric Dentistry. The Paediatric Dentistry Department within Glasgow Dental Hospital and School may offer clinical experience in the following: new patient assessment clinics; treatment sessions, including inhalation sedation; accident and emergency; dental trauma; and multidisciplinary clinics. Clinical time will also be spent within the Royal Hospital for Children (RHC) where DCTs may gain experience in new patient assessment and treatment of medically complex children, and will be involved in the in-/ out-patient care of children requiring priority dental care, including those with</p>

		oncology, haematology and cardiac diagnoses.

10.	Pattern of working, including any on-call commitment	40 hours per week, Mon-Fri 9.00 am - 5.00pm
11.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Post DCT Fellows which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme will include an induction followed by a number of study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events will be delivered with a mix of face to face and online sessions, which will include all Post DCT Fellows training in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference which includes the DCT1s, DCT2s and DCT3s. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. Post DCT fellowship posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.
