4.	<b>Training unit/location/s</b>	This post takes place within NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde health board. The main base is Glasgow Dental Hospital and School (GDH) in the Oral Surgery and Oral Medicine Departments There may also be clinics in other GGC centres.

8.	<b>Description of the training post</b>	<p><b>These posts are currently modified due to the on-going need for social distancing. As restrictions ease the timetables will be altered accordingly.</b></p> <p>The Oral Surgery department offers a broad range of clinical activities and experience in the following; consultant clinics, treatment area, minor oral surgery sessions, supervision of BDS students, sedation, treatment and theatre lists at non base hospital sites. One session per week is allocated for QI projects. There is a regular journal club (on-line), at which DCTs are expected to present to benefit from appraisal by senior staff.</p> <p>The Department of Oral Medicine receives referrals from a wide geographical area as it provides the main specialty referral centre for the West of Scotland. It is currently relying heavily on video consultations to see both new and review patients. There is a rapid access facility for fast-tracking suspected oral malignancies. Core training post holders work with all members of staff during their post. There is a phlebotomy service supported by trained dental nurses.</p> <p>Both departments in this post have been extensively refurbished in recent years and offer excellent clinical facilities.</p>
9.	<b>Primary Care training element</b>	None
10.	<b>Pattern of working, including any on-call commitment</b>	40 hours per week, Mon-Fri 9.00 am - 5.00 pm
11.	<b>Educational programme summary and library facilities</b>	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Post DCT Fellows which incorporates components of the DCT curriculum. These events will involve all the Post DCT Fellows in Scotland and will be held virtually during 2021.

		<p>The annual trainee conference will give an opportunity for all Dental Core Trainees to submit work to be presented.</p> <p>The Post DCT Fellowship posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects or research. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP.</p>
