8.	Description of the training post	<p>Fife OMFS is a busy, thriving and dynamic unit with its main base in the Victoria Hospital, Kirkcaldy. It serves a population of approximately 300000. The team is comprised of 3 Consultants, 1 Associate Specialist, 6 Specialty Doctors, 3 DCT2s and 2 DCT3s. It provides a comprehensive regional OMFS service, with head and neck oncology being treated in NHS Tayside. The Fife team undertake all facial trauma surgery, skin surgery, dentoalveolar surgery as well as offering a modern 3D planned orthognathic service.</p> <p>The successful post-holder will gain experience of acute maxillofacial complaints, managing inpatients, recognising the sick patient, participating in general outpatient clinics as well as specialist head & neck and orthognathic clinics assisting in Theatre and develop skills in the management of orofacial sepsis. There will also be hands on experience in dentoalveolar and skin surgery in both local and general anaesthetic settings.</p> <p>The post is extremely well supported and there are many opportunities to learn and develop your skills. There is also potential scope to sit in on Orthodontic clinics.</p> <p>Geographically, Kirkcaldy is situated in the heart of Fife being 24 miles from St Andrews, 30 miles from Edinburgh and Dundee and 55 miles from Glasgow.</p>

Pattern of working, including any on-call commitment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The current working pattern is a rolling rota with an average of 48hrs per week. • Currently out of hours on-call is 1:4 Mon-Thurs & 1:4 Friday. • Each DCT will have 1:4 weekday on-call shift (Mon-Thurs 1700- 0000hrs resident, non-resident – 08.00) & 1:4 Friday overnight (until 0800hrs

		Saturday) There may also be a 1in7 rolling 1 st on-call weekend rota (Saturday 0800-Monday 0800hrs) with Monday off in lieu.
11.	Educational programme summary and library facilities	<p>There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Post DCT Fellows which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme will include an induction followed by a number of study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events will be delivered with a mix of face to face and online sessions, which will include all Post DCT Fellows training in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference which includes the DCT1s, DCT2s and DCT3s. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. Post DCT fellowship posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.</p> <p>All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course: Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will be made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course.</p>
