
HEALTHCARE SCIENCE STAFF CAREER FRAMEWORK LEVELS 2-4 UPDATE

The NES Healthcare Science Team launched their Healthcare Science Support Worker Framework for Career levels 2-4, on March 19th, 2024. The framework was adapted from the Nursing, Midwifery and Allied Health Professionals (NMAHP) framework and was part of a wider Scottish Government Commission.

The Healthcare Science Support Worker framework:

- Supports the roles and educational requirements for Healthcare Science Support Workers at Career Levels 2-4
- Identifies learning resources to support staff at each of the three levels using the 4 Pillars of Practice namely: Clinical Practice, Facilitation of Learning
- Leadership and Service Improvement
- Identifies routes to support staff into registered roles



REFLECTIONS ON HEALTHCARE SCIENCE WEEK

This year Healthcare Science week was held from 11th March to 17th March with a host of activities and participation from the NES HCS team, DYW Live, My world of work, the Scottish Government CSO team, the NHS Careers team as well as our in-service colleagues across the NHS boards. Our updated NES HCS website was populated with resources and guidance for participation detailing how to get involved including the programme of organised events, virtual and social media engagement. We also published our new healthcare Science career guidance booklet along with over 9 new profiles published on our NHS Scotland Careers website. The key objective was to raise awareness of the many career opportunities in Healthcare Science and to raise the Healthcare Science public profile.

We had a schedule of career and STEM engagement events supported by our colleagues at NHS Lothian, NHS Grampian, NSS - SNBTS, and NHS Tayside. Events such as an online University Careers Webinar to 5 Scottish Universities was open to students only and promoted through the University career advisors group with our NHS colleagues from NHS Lothian in Cardiac Physiology and Genetics talking about their career stories and routes into the NHS roles for HCS with over 100 attendees.

Glasgow Science Centre supported a Curious About Live Sessions, a free online science resource for school pupils aged 6-13. We hosted the 'Meet the Biomedical Scientist' session to P2 - S2 with 1090 in attendance. Working with the My World of Work team for HCS Career videos for Sleep, Respiratory and Medical Physics from our colleagues in NHS GGC and NHS Tayside distributed over social media.

Working with DYWLive Online School sessions aimed at P6-S6, learners, with help from our colleagues, we delivered a session about becoming a cardiac physiologist (NHS Grampian) and a sleep physiologist (NHS Lothian) with great interaction from the pupils.



Our NHS Healthcare Scientist colleagues from NHS Grampian participated in various STEM activities including Virtual Reality Space lab for Biomedical Science, Genetics lego and learning about cardiac science at the main hall arena at the Aberdeen Science Centre. Whilst at Dundee Science Centre, our colleagues at NHS Tayside and SNBTS engaged with 69 school pupils with a variety of microbiology, blood grouping, medical physics and genetics STEM activities that were all well received to inspire out future healthcare scientists. It was a great week full of engagement and raising awareness for Healthcare Science.
