# **Educational Resource** Evaluation

Fifteen participants from NHS Community Chaplaincy Listening Service and Spiritual Care Teams completed five self-paced eLearning modules exploring six grief theories.

Following this self-directed learning, focus groups and one-to-one sessions were conducted to evaluate the impact of the educational resources.

## **Key Findings:**

15 Participants 100% immediate application 2-3 weeks to impact

- Strong rejection of Kübler Ross' Model
- Exceptional enthusiasm for neurobiological models
- Enhanced professional confidence and credibility
- Personal healing alongside professional growth

# Neurobiological breakthrough:

- O'Connor's Grieving Brain & Body models provided scientific validation and accessible language for emotion-resistant populations
- "You can remove the word emotion and talk about brain chemicals"
- These models were found especially useful for neurodivergent individuals

## **Toolkit Philosophy:**

- Participants embraced flexible, multi-model approach over a rigid, single-theory application
- "Like having a bag full of resources - pull out the best one for each person"
- Applications visual tools, scientific explanations, multiple connections

# **Before Training:**

- Limited to Kübler-Ross knowledge
- "Bits and pieces" understanding
- Fears about knowing "too little"
- Linear, stage-based thinking

#### **After Training:**

- Kaleidoscopic understanding
- Person-centred responses
- Enhanced professional confidence
- Immediate practical application
