Our assurance of Training

Training Centre Accreditation

Thirteen centres have successful completed the Centre Accreditation process this quarter, with another seven centres having started the process. We appreciate everyone's participation and we have been very impressed with the standards evidenced within recently assessed departments.

The process has highlighted possible areas for improvement in some of the training centres and NES are currently assisting with the implementation of action plans within two training centres. It is uplifting to see a positive change in the standard of training across Healthcare Science as a direct result of our Centre Accreditation process.

Twenty-one centres currently hosting trainees are yet to respond to the request in July for completion of the online Microsoft Form. We appreciate that the form is detailed, and some centres may still be working through their response. Reminders will be sent out within the next few weeks, and we would appreciate it if these centres could work with us to ensure the process is completed.

ARCP and Training Plans 2022

We will be in touch with all current trainees and registered supervisors in September to request completion of the ARCP and Training Plan process for 2022. Up to date training plans and annual reviews of competency are vital for all trainees, both to ensure appropriate training progression and maintain morale. We would appreciate communication from trainees and/ or supervisors if there are any issues which preclude completion of either the Training Plan or ARCP process. We understand how busy HCS departments are, and we want to work with you to ensure appropriate trainee support is in place.

Confidential Trainee and Supervisor Survey

We will also be in contact with all trainees and supervisors to request completion of the annual confidential surveys. This is your chance to highlight any issues or requirements. All forms are confidential, but if there is something you would like the NES HCS team to assist you with there is also the option to record your details and we will be in touch to see how we can help. Please use this opportunity to communicate directly with us, we have a supportive role for both trainees and supervisors and we are happy to help in any way we can.

Exit Survey

It is important to record the subsequent career path of our trainees after completion of their training. An Exit Survey will be sent out to all trainees who have completed or are due to complete their training in 2022. We will also send the request to their supervisors as we realise that some trainees may have moved from their training department. NES have a duty to commission HCS training, for the benefit of the HCS departments and the wider NHS, and we would therefore appreciate your assistance in gathering this data.
