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9.	<p>Description of training post</p>	<p>The post in PDS will run from September 2026 to March 2027.</p> <p>As a DCT1 in Tayside Public Dental Service team, you'll enjoy a truly varied and rewarding role. Your work will span community settings, giving you the chance to make a real difference to those who need care the most.</p> <p>You'll broaden your clinical skills through participation in general anaesthetic lists, provision of domiciliary care and receive hands-on training in inhalation sedation. You'll be able to treat priority groups in varied settings including the mobile dental unit and be able to gain experience in using specialist equipment such as wheelchair platforms. This post offers an excellent foundation for future specialty training—whether in paediatric dentistry, special care dentistry, or any other dental specialty—helping you build confidence in managing diverse patient groups while working within a supportive, multidisciplinary team committed to compassionate, holistic care.</p> <p>The PDS is about treating the patient as a whole, not just the mouth! Educational programme summary	There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement & Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual DCT conference. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This is predominantly to fund attendance of DCTs at the compulsory NES Educational events, however funding may be available to contribute to the cost of other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.
