| 8. | <b>Description of the training post</b>                              | <p>The GDH part of the post will commence in September 2023 through to March 2024. This placement is ideally suited to anyone interested in Orthodontics or Paediatric Dentistry. The Orthodontic department offers a wide range of orthodontic experience including consultant supervised treatment/review sessions, new patient clinics and Emergency clinics. Opportunities are available to attend a variety of joint clinics in orthognathic surgery, paediatrics, cleft care and restorative dentistry to give as wide an exposure as possible to the range of orthodontic treatment carried out within the hospital.</p> <p>The Paediatric Department in GDH may offer clinical experience in the following: new patient assessment; treatment sessions, including inhalation sedation; dental accident and emergency; dental trauma management; and multidisciplinary clinics. Clinical time will also be spent within RHCG where DCTs may gain experience in new patient assessment and treatment of medically complex children and</p> |

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|     |   | <p>the in-/ out-patient care of children requiring priority dental care, including those with oncology, haematology and cardiac diagnoses.</p> <p>In the second part of the post, from March 2024 to August 2024 you will have the opportunity to work in a variety of locations in PDS with a range of clinical supervisors. You will be involved in/have experience of the delivery of a range of treatment for vulnerable PDS patient groups, including children and adults with special care needs and unscheduled care. In anxiety management you will receive training in Inhalation Sedation and may be able to participate in GA sessions. There may also be opportunities for experience in Primary Care Public Health activity, such as NDIP. There will be a requirement to travel within the NHS Greater Glasgow &amp; Clyde health board area to different PDS clinics.</p>  |
| 9.  | <b>Primary Care training element</b>                        | In this post the DCT1 will work for six months in the PDS. You therefore need to be eligible for an NHS list number.  |
| 10. | <b>Educational programme summary and library facilities</b> | There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement & Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by a number of face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual trainee conference. All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This may be used to access MFDS/MFD/MJDF courses and other courses linked to an agreed PDP. DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects. |
