9.	<b>Description of training post</b>	The Oral Surgery part of the post gives the opportunity for assessment and treatment of new patients allowing the post holder to gain wide, well supported, experience. This post gives the opportunity to perform a variety of surgical procedures, including extractions, biopsies and treatment of more complex conditions under LA, sedation and GA.

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		<p>The Oral Pathology component of the first 6-month rotation will consist of 1 day a week at the Edinburgh Royal Infirmary pathology department. The post holder will be able to exploit the links between oral surgery and pathology as they follow patients on their journey. The trainee will gain experience in specimen dissection, microscopic reporting, and interpretation of modern diagnostic techniques under the close supervision of a Consultant Oral and Maxillofacial Pathologist. While the focus will be on enhancing clinical diagnostic skills, there will be additional opportunities for QI/research project work within the department.</p> <p>The OMFS part of the post is based in a busy Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery unit with a dedicated ward. Post holders will gain experience in the management of oncology, trauma and facial deformity in outpatient clinics and operating lists. The post also offers experience of dento-alveolar surgery under general anaesthesia, local anaesthesia, inhalational and intravenous sedation. A medical FY1 doctor supports patient ward care.</p>

12.	<b>Pattern of working including any on-call commitment</b>	<p>Oral Surgery / Oral Pathology - 40 Hours per week, 9:00am - 5:00pm. There is not out of hours requirement in this half of the rotation.</p> <p>OMFS rotation - 48 hours/week with a banding supplement for the on-call commitment. Standard day 08.30 to 5.30pm</p>
13.	<b>Educational programme summary</b>	<p>There is a Scotland-wide education programme for Dental Core Trainees which is designed to match the DCT curriculum. The programme has four themes running through each year of Dental Core Training. These are: Clinical, Communication, Career Development Skills and Quality Improvement &amp; Patient Safety. Posts begin with a local health board and NES induction, followed by face-to-face study events throughout the year, supported by Turas Learn. These events include all Dental Core Trainees in Scotland, as does the annual DCT conference.</p> <p>All trainees have access to study leave time (in line with terms and conditions of service) and budget. This is predominantly to fund attendance of DCTs at the compulsory NES Educational events, however funding may be available to contribute to the cost of other courses linked to an agreed PDP.</p> <p>DCT posts include time for self-directed learning and trainees are encouraged to use this time for personal study and to complete quality improvement projects.</p>

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		All DCTs, who have not worked in an Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS) unit in Scotland previously, attend an additional two-day induction course known as Maxfacts. This course is designed to cover the essential skills for an OMFS DCT post and is delivered by OMFS consultants and senior trainees. The teaching is backed up by on-line resources which will be made available to DCTs prior to the Maxfacts course
